FAQ's

Where do the seminars take place? Currently, CALL offers seminars at two locations in the Phoenix area, in the East Valley and at the Diocesan Pastoral Center.

What if my teen misses a seminar? Teens who cannot make either of the dates may make up the seminar in the following year of the program. DVDs of filmed presentations are available on a limited basis by emailing CALL.

My teen is older, a junior in high school. Can they still participate? Please email or call us about your situation. Generally, if a teen would like to find a way to attend any or all of the seminars, we will work with your teen.

Who are the speakers and how do I know who will present to my child? Please see the Speakers Page on the website and the impressive list of speakers for CALL. They bring expertise and knowledge with the ability to speak effectively to teens. All are faithful to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church. See the downloads section of the website for a list of the speakers for that year.

What if finances keep my teen from attending? There are hard costs involved in maintaining the CALL program. However, it is very important to us that your teen receives leadership formation in his or her faith, so please contact us if finances are preventing your teen from attending.

What is the refund policy? In accord with the Diocesan Finance Department Refund Policy, a fee of \$25 is charged for all refunds requested if a teen withdraws before attending any of the seminars.

Our 3-Year Program

CALL is a speaker-based program for busy teens. Meeting only 4 times a year, CALL provides engaging and deep seminars given by dynamic, qualified presenters in a 3-year format, grouped into these primary themes:

Year 1: Theology of the Body

Year 2: The Beauty of the Body

Year 3: Bioethics and College Preparedness

Students can enter at any grade of high school, or opt for an 8th grade start date. Most begin as high school freshman and graduate at the end of their junior year.

After CALL Graduation, students can apply to become CALL Mentors, immediately living out their CALL formation, helping to lead the program and acting as peer mentors to younger students, while receiving deeper formation in the Gospel of Life.

Requirements for Graduation

All CALL Graduates receive a Catholic Academy for Life Leadership certificate at the Graduation Mass honoring each of the CALL graduates in late spring of their third year, after completion of the following requirements have been met. This can then be listed on college and scholarship applications.

- 1. Attend and receive credit for all 12 seminars
- 2. Attend two (2) spiritual retreats.
- 3. Perform 15 service hours per year. All 15 hours must be turned in by April 1 of each year, for a total of 45 by graduation year.



MODESTY

Modesty is a controversial topic in today's culture. While our culture encourages immodest dress and behavior, CALL supports the practice of modesty at all times, in order to live out the teachings of CALL and the Catholic Church. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, modesty protects the mystery of persons and their love. Modesty is decency. Modesty inspires a way of life which makes it possible to resist the allurements of fashion and the pressures of prevailing ideologies. Modesty is also a integral part of the cardinal virtue of temperance, the habitual and holy practice of self-control.

Theology of the Body

CALL introduces St. John Paul II's teaching on Theology of the Body, providing the framework for authentic life and love. CALL teens are formed to recognize Truth in God's design for all of mankind. CALL teens attend the Year 1 Retreat, "Encounter", or a substitute retreat with their parish youth.

Wonderfully Created in a Broken World

Building upon the foundations from Year 1, CALL continues by addressing the dignity of the human person through biology, the realities of abortion, and by identifying and discussing the many "normalized" cultural

Bioethics/College Preparedness

In Year 3, CALL unpacks and addresses the hot topic of Bioethics, educating the teens through the Catholic moral lens in such areas as biotechnology, stem cell research, euthanasia and end-of-life issues. CALL wraps up the year by preparing teens for life in college. CALL teens attend the Year 3 Retreat, "Called and Chosen", or a substitute retreat with their parish youth. 3

Behavior Guidelines

CALL knows how challenging it is to raise holy, healthy and happy teens in today's culture. In times past, the prevailing culture supported the same values as our Catholic faith. However, times have changed and it has become harder for parents to feel supported in their parenting choices. To that end, CALL encourages a truly Catholic culture, and provides an environment where modesty is both desired and expected to be the norm.

All CALL events require that teens follow these guidelines for attendance. CALL also encourages parents and teens to acknowledge these norms for everyday living, as members of the Catholic Academy for Life Leadership.

DRESS

- 1. Modest dress is required at all times, in order to proclaim the dignity of the human person.
- 2. Casual attire is fine for all CALL meetings.
- 3. No short shorts. Shorts deemed in the retail store as 3 inches or more are recommended; fingertips should rest no more than 2 inches below the bottom of the shorts.
- 4. Skirt lengths at no more than 2 inches above the knee are acceptable.
- 5. No leggings worn as pants, or with sweatshirts or sweaters tied around the waist. Leggings are acceptable when worn with a mid-thigh blouse or dress.
- 6. No low or cut-out tops or blouses. Tops worn should *not* be so tight, loose, or so low that when bending over, cleavage shows. The best guideline: tops should rest no lower than 4 fingers below the pit of the throat.
- 7. For any CALL events that offer swimming: tankini or onepiece swimsuits are suitable for girls, and full swim trunks for boys. No bikinis or two piece swimsuits for girls or speedos for boys.
- 8. No t-shirts with inappropriate slogans or logos.
- 9. No bra straps showing at any time.
- 10. Mass attire for CALL events and graduation includes proper dress, expressing self-dignity and gratitude to the Lord, with appropriate dress lengths defined above. No strappy dresses or bare shoulders. Business casual or dress pants and shirts for boys.

CALL Mentor Program

CALL graduates who have the time and passion for the teachings of CALL are invited to apply for a CALL Mentor position. CALL Mentors make a year-long commitment to assist in the running of CALL seminars and act as role models for the younger CALL teens.

WHO IS SELECTED AS A CALL MENTOR?

- 1. Typically, CALL mentors are seniors in high school, or those who now attend a local college or university.
- 2. Any graduate of the CALL program that best exemplifies all of the CALL teachings in his or her daily life is qualified to apply.
- 3. CALL Mentor applicants must complete a lengthy application that includes an essay and a willingness to commit to attending two mentor training meetings, and four or more CALL seminars during the year.
- 4. Those who are selected receive deeper catechetical formation and are also trained to help in a variety of ways. CALL Mentors have expressed how much they appreciate circling back to the teachings in the 12 seminars that they get to re-visit anew as older teens.
- 5. There is no cost to become a CALL Mentor, but college bound CALL Mentors are eligible to apply for one of two \$1000 college scholarships to be awarded each spring.

GETTING STARTED WITH CALL

REGISTERING WITH CALL

- 1. Register your teen for CALL by visiting https://catholicacademyforlifeleadership.org
- 2. Save your password for easy reference and the emails you use for each of your teens in CALL.
- 3. Choose the CALL seminar location most convenient for you and register for each of the four seminars. If you need to change later, you will be able to do so online.
- 4. Attend each seminar and make sure your teen signs in. Parents are highly encouraged to stay for each seminar!
- 5. Consider discussing the seminar topics on the drive home or shortly after attendance of each seminar. Within a week, you'll receive an email with the teaching points covered. We encourage parents to read this email and use it to keep the conversation going at home.

RENEWING FOR YEAR 2 OR YEAR 3

- 1. To renew your teen's account, visit https://catholicacademyforlifeleadership.org as if you are registering for the first time.
- 2. Log in using your teen's existing username and password and email. If you have forgotten the password, you can request them there. If you have forgotten your teen's email address, please ask for help by emailing: call@dphx.org
- 3. After paying your annual fee, make sure that you return to the CALL webpage and select all seminars and applicable retreats.

CALL'S COMMITMENT: Assist in forming well-rounded

VOLUNTEER SERVICE HOURS

- 1. Teens are required to complete 15 service hours each CALL seminar year. Various opportunities are emailed throughout the year, but it is the parent's responsibility to assist your son or daughter in finding other opportunities. A volunteer tracker sheet is provided at the start of each year so that you can record your teens service hours. Approved volunteer service opportunities are listed in the downloads section of the website.
- 2. Turn in the service hours via email by April 1 of each year: Parents should send one email to call@dphx.org listing all of the volunteer hours recorded on the tracker. List each service agency, hours served and dates of service. We use an honor system so no signature from the agency is required. If your teen attends a Catholic High School and performs service hours already, these hours can also be reported as CALL hours.

Retreats

CALL REQUIRES TEENS TO ATTEND TWO RETREATS WITHIN THE THREE YEARS OF CALL

Most parishes and Catholic schools provide overnight retreats for your teens to attend. Every retreat is a chance to spend time alone with Jesus in quiet prayer, confession and Adoration, while at the same time bringing like-minded peers together in a fun , safe place to share the faith! CALL teens are highly encouraged to attend retreats through their parish or Catholic school. Other conferences and pilgrimages fulfill the requirement, including attendance at the summer Steubenville West Conference or the annual March for Life in Washington DC and San Francisco.
